FORWARD BY FOUNDER/PRESIDENT

CREATING EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

The year was 2010, about 11 years ago from now, I saw a 6 years old child selling newspapers on a local bus. A thought crossed my mind- this kid should be in school; he should not be selling newspapers to make both ends meet for his survival. The thought got stuck in my mind. That was the beginning. I took an initiative to facilitate quality education for underprivileged children. My friends came along to join the initiative. Thus, OBHIZATRIK Foundation was born. A group of enthusiastic youth volunteers joined us. The group started to grow bigger and bigger. While working with the motto of changing Bangladesh for a better future, we had to face a lot of hurdles throughout these 11 years. But no hurdle was too high to jump over for us, because we always have volunteers, our well-wishers, and a group of young people who are undefeatable by our side.

Each year has been a new step for us, and with every step OBHIZATRIK Foundation has reached a new height now. It has changed the lives of many people, showing a way of being self-reliable to many families in these 11 years.

In 2016, the SHOKKHOM project started with only 2 families. Now in 2021, we have 1200 families who are self-sufficiently earning their living because of the SHOKKHOM project.

We have enlightened the torch of education for about 1100 underprivileged children of Bangladesh. Once these children had uncertain futures. Now they are the authors of their own lives, writing their own stories.

OBHIZATRIK Foundation has always extended its hands to help the people during an emergency or in the aftermath of a natural disaster.

In the year 2020, COVID -19 pandemic had the world come to a standstill. But OBHIZATRIK Foundation never stopped for a moment. We worked tirelessly to stop the spread of the Coronavirus. We put up posters promoting health hygiene and social distancing.

To enable people to maintain hygiene practices we have established handwash stations and basins in different

areas of Dhaka. Our volunteers were always active during this period to stop the spread of covid-19.

We arranged 'Bina Poishar Bazar' an initiative where people received daily commodities without having to pay any money. It was to help the working-class people who have been affected most due to the pandemic.

OBHIZATRIK Foundation has helped 1.2 million people during the COVID-19 pandemic in different ways. Our volunteers conducted the burial procedure of deceased COVID patients by maintaining health safety regulations. Oxygen cylinders were promptly delivered to the homes of COVID patients who were confined to their homes and were unable to receive clinical help.

We have provided SHOKKHOM projects to the families who have lost their earning source during the lockdown. Our role model, the Father of our Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, envisioned a prosperous and substantial Bangladesh. OBHIZATRIK Foundation works for the disadvantaged group, to ensure they have the opportunity to lead dignified lifestyles so that they can be a part of the development mainstream.

OBHIZATRIK Foundation has always been standing beside the people in need, still is and always will be.

We are eternally grateful to those who have cooperated, encouraged, and supported us in our journey.

We remain indebted to our supporters. This spark of positive change couldn't have been possible without their generous and steadfast help.

A COLLECTIVE DREAM FOR THE GREATER GOOD

OBHIZATRIK Foundation is a non-profit organization focused on improving the various socio-economic issues haunting Bangladesh. The organization's prime target group for project conceptualization and implementation are the underprivileged population of our country. Established in 2010 and registered under Government of Bangladesh (S-12013), OBHIZATRIK Foundation has since been engaged in various short-term and long term projects and campaigns to bring about positive impact in the lives and livelihood of many Bangladeshis living below the poverty line.

In September 2021, OBHIZATRIK Foundation passed 11 years of humanitarian activities. The organization currently runs four long term sustainable projects consistently and several short term campaigns held throughout the year.

The idea of OBHIZATRIK Foundation budded from a single humanitarian act. The founder, Ahmed Imtiaz Jami, was inspired to help street children working as their family's breadwinners. These children were deprived of the basic right to education and were forced to engage in various types of low-paying jobs so that they could have at least one meal a day. Problems coming with poverty and financial insolvencies hit children the hardest. Many children of our country are thus exploited to criminal activities, abuse and child labour. An idea was thus borne out of the need to help underprivileged children, to create a safe and affordable learning environment for them so that they can grow and spend their childhood like every other average children in Bangladesh.

A bunch of young activists thus grouped together to realize the common goal of building a platform that will provide free education to underprivileged children whose parents could not afford their education.

In their endeavour they faced many challenges disguised as social issues. But that didn't stop them facing these challenges head on and attempt to solve these problems.

Lack of education among these underprivileged children were mainly due to their parents' financial insolvencies. Some parents simply doesn't send their children to school due to high expense surrounding education. Whereas some parents engage their children in work in order to have an extra income-earning member in the family. This approach leads to enhanced child labour and many children engaging in dangerous streams of work. And the root cause of this problem is poverty and unemployment in the parents or adult members of the children's families.

In order to enthuse children to join a free education system, their parents had to be relieved of their financial and unemployment problems. Parents and guardians of underprivileged children need to be given opportunities to earn livelihood so that they do not force or have to rely on their underaged children to earn money.

OBHIZATRIK Foundation was thus born to address the overall issues of poverty, education and unemployment in the lives of the underprivileged population of our country. With time, the organization became an active advocate for people living below the poverty line and focused on finding and implementing innovative solutions to problems affecting their lives.

This is to bringing positive change in the lives of the underprivileged.

This, is to *changing Bangladesh*.



OUR VENTURES AND ACTIVITIES

WITH A VIEW TO CHANGING BANGLADESH

OBHIZATRIK Foundation was formed with the concept to dissolve different types of socio-economic disparities that regularly affect the lives of the under-privileged in Bangladesh.

The organization started out with a handful of youth volunteers struggling to spread awareness and raise funds so that they could initiate their campaigns and projects. Now, after 11 years of initiation, the organization is currently a strong body of more than 3500 volunteers across Bangladesh, over 450 donors and 20 corporate sponsors worldwide. The organization has benefited more than 2500 beneficiaries through long-term projects and approximately 5.5 lac people through short-term campaigns and emergency aid.

OBHIZATRIK Foundation currently strives to fulfill the Sustainable Development Goals 1-No poverty, 2-Zero Hunger, 3-Good Health and well-being, 4-Quality Education and 5-Gender Equality. The organization has four long-term, sustainable projects focused on providing full-free quality education, livelihood earning opportunities, ensuring food and nutrition security and free healthcare facilities for the less-privileged. Additionally, our voluntary activities include organizing and executing food campaigns for the destitute, providing relief medicine and resource support during times of crisis and natural disasters, distributing free healthcare equipment to rural health workers, providing winter gifts to the underprivileged and carrying free educational program related to maternal health and child health and sanitation behavior.

The organization's head office is located in Mirpur, Dhaka. Beside this, there are two more branch offices located in Char Lata in Patuakhali district and Trishal upazila in Mymensingh. OBHIZATRIK school has three campuses in Mirpur and Rayerbazar in Dhaka and in Char Lata village in Patuakhali. The organization regularly carries out food support campaigns, health camps and other volunteering events across 32 districts in Bangladesh. SHOKKHOM Livelihood projects have been implemented in Dhaka, Mymensingh, Gazipur, Rangpur, Kushtia and Patuakhali. Boat ambulance is active in approximately 6 sub-districts in Patuakhali's coastal areas.

FREE EDUCATION

Ever since OBHIZATRIK School was established, we have provided free quality education to more than 2500 children in Mirpur and Rayerbazar, Dhaka and Char Lata, Patuakhali. As part of the education program, students also received free stationery items, meals and groceries.



ACCESSIBLE HEALTHCARE

OVER 5500 PATIENTS RECEIVED FREE HEALTHCARE SERVICES AND MEDICINES SUPPORT

OBHIZATRIK Foundation provides healthcare support to rural village communities of Bangladesh. Our boat ambulance MB Payra provides first-aid support in the southern Char regions of the country. During the COVID-19 pandemic, more than **100,000** free sanitizers and face masks and **2500** medical grade PPE were distributed. We also provided affordable medical grade oxygen cylinders to the underprivileged. Our volunteers conducted burial of **100** deceased from COVID.

One fine morning in Dhaka, a young man hopped inside a local bus to travel to his college. After a while, the bus stuck in the ever-present traffic of the magical Dhaka. Irritatingly the man looked outside the window. Rows upon rows of cars, buses, and rickshaws laid ahead in a chaotic jumbled mess. Dotted the streets, several people carrying different objects competed to get the passengers' attention. They were the street vendors. Unlike the street-side vendors, these sellers were always on the move. They carried their sales items in bags and ran from car to car, bus to bus, trying to sell their products. The young man noticed several sellers getting in the bus he was on.

Amongst them, a particular seller caught his eye.

A child, no more than 8, draped in a tattered t-shirt and dirty pants. The boy was screaming at the top of his lungs trying to sell newspapers.

Despite being heart-wrenching, it was a common scenario in Dhaka city.

Residents of this metropolis were immune to situations like these.

But the young man that day felt a steady stream of guilt welling up inside him.

He called the boy and bought a newspaper from him. He wanted to give him something more, but the traffic signals turned green, and the boy was already jumping out of the bus.

As the bus moved, the young man wondered how much he could have earned if he was in that's boy situation. He realized his earnings would be enough to sustain him a day's meal, maybe two.

But that was all.

Every day would be the same, running to and fro, constantly exposed to dangers of the street and accidents only to earn a few plates of food.

The young man realized how unsustainable and fragile the boy's attempt at life and livelihood was. He couldn't help wonder about alternatives, long-term solutions for the proper growth of this child and every other street child struggling to earn bread instead of going to school to be, educated, responsible citizens of Bangladesh.



ABOUT OBHIZATRIK SCHOOL

A FREE SCHOOL FOR THE UNDER PRIVILEGED

Education is the bend point for individuals to transcend their limitations. Proper education opens up a world of opportunities for any individual willing to grow and acquire positive change. The *Universal Declaration of Human Rights* affirms that, education is a fundamental right for everyone irrespective of race, gender, ethnicity or social origin. So, what does this entail?

According to *UNESCO*, education as a fundamental right demands that,

1. Primary education is free of cost, compulsory and universal
2. Secondary education including technical and vocational education is available and accessible to the general public and is progressively free.
3. Higher education is accessible to all on the basis of individual capacity and is progressively free.
4. Fundamental education for those who have failed to complete education
5. Training opportunities to enhance practical education
6. Availing equal quality education through minimum standards
7. Quality teaching, supplies, fellowship system, and material conditions for teachers and teaching staff
8. Freedom of choice

Despite this, many underprivileged children of our country who suffer from financial insolvencies are deprived of the right to education. This deprives them of a lifetime of opportunities.

OBHIZATRIK School was borne out of the idea to make quality education accessible for the often overlooked underprivileged children so that they can grow up to be self-reliant empowered citizens of Bangladesh.

Bangladesh is a small country sheltering approximately 164.7 million people. A report by the World Bank reveals that almost 11.9% of the entire population of Bangladesh suffered from poverty in the pre-pandemic years. The COVID-19 pandemic spiked up the poverty rate to almost 12.9% by 2021. The pandemic made the poverty situation of Bangladesh dire, which was already critical before.

When OBHIZATRIK Foundation started its work in 2010, one of its primary goals was to provide full-free quality education to underprivileged children. Many talented children in our country remain deprived of the opportunity to acquire formal education due to financial insufficiencies. These less privileged children are burdened with the fate of life-long poverty and social discrimination. OBHIZATRIK Foundation's sustainable initiative, OBHIZATRIK School started with the mission to provide full-free quality education to children from pre-education level to higher secondary level with no additional costs of stationery and food.

The objectives of OBHIZATRIK School are:

1. Ensure literacy skills of the less privileged children
2. To provide formal education based on the NCTB curriculum
3. To provide them facilities of food and daily necessities so that their parents do not have to bear the extra burdens and prevent them from attending school
4. To provide technical skills training to students in order to make them skills efficient
5. To create a joyous learning and social environment for the less privileged children

Registered under the Ministry of Primary and Mass Education, OBHIZATRIK School aims to provide full-free quality education to underprivileged children of Bangladesh. The goal of OBHIZATRIK School is to close the gap between financially insolvent children and quality education. It paves the way for less-privileged but gifted and hard-working children to access facilities and opportunities they could not have afforded before. The school provides educational accessories such as notebooks, pencils, pens, books, uniforms, school bags, and many more. This arrangement relieves the students and their guardians to avoid unnecessary costs of learning accessories. Besides proper and quality educational support, OBHIZATRIK School ensures weekly medical health checkups, free-of-cost medicine, and nutritious food for the students and their parents. The school also assures that students receive education in a fun-filled learning environment. To promote a diverse education, OBHIZATRIK School arranges provisions for various co-curricular activities so students can have a memorable learning experience. Co-curricular activities include student clubs, cultural programs, sports festivals, and study tours.

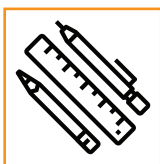

Khadiza, the eldest of her three siblings, lives in a small 2-room slum apartment with her parents. As her family shares the apartment with three other families, it can get very crowded at times. Khadiza and everyone else in her building have to stand in long queues to use the toilet, the cooking stove, and the bathroom. With the rising price of food and other necessary items, Khadiza's parents have difficulty earning enough money to feed their children. Her parents, misguided by their surrounding neighbors and relatives, sometimes think of marrying off Khadiza so that they are relieved of her extra expenses of education and upbringing.

But in the quiet of the evening, when Khadiza sits with her textbooks and school works, she dreams of a different future for herself. Many years ago, when she was small, Khadiza once spotted a female police officer in the streets of Dhaka. The lady officer was commanding a troop of male officers. Her attitude proved that she was undoubtedly higher in ranks than them.

Khadiza was awed at the lady police officer, her stately uniform, and her power to command over others. In her tiny voice, unheard by her father, Khadiza softly said, "I want to be like her."

A tiny childhood dream planted deep inside little Khadiza's mind. As time flew by, Khadiza's childhood dream became her goal in life. Khadiza dreamed strongly of becoming a police officer.

It is why, despite her surroundings, her unfair life, and her family's thoughts on marrying her off, Khadiza walked to school every single day. She knows she has to get proper education to fulfill her dreams. She knows that, despite the obstacles in her path, her school will always be there for her. Her beloved teachers will always be by her side, encouraging her, supporting her to be the woman she wants to be: a strong, intelligent, and commanding woman dedicated to the service of her homeland.

In case of any medical emergencies, our teachers take us to a doctor and provide us with necessary medicines. I have made a lot of friends here at OBHIZATRIK School. It's fun to learn together and spend time together. I want to complete my school education and pursue a college degree so that I can acquire a respectable job in society.



A UNIQUE APPROACH TO EMPOWER THE EXTREME POOR

In the Bengali vocabulary, SHOKKHOM means being skillful or competent in a certain field of profession. In 2016, OBHIZATRIK Foundation first conceptualized the idea of providing free-of-cost and fully developed business models to the extreme poor. The goal of the project, entitled as SHOKKHOM, was to alleviate poverty and increase employment among the disadvantaged and destitute people of our country.

SHOKKHOM was initially implemented in 2016 at a very small scale involving only two families to see its results. The results of the test projects were highly positive, as beneficiaries started to see profit and make further investments on their business. Pondering its positive outcome, SHOKKHOM was redacted at a larger scale during 2017 to 2021. Now, after almost 5 years of activity, SHOKKHOM has a net total of 1200 beneficiaries across seven districts in Bangladesh.

INSPIRATION

Initially, SHOKKHOM projects were implemented by Zakat paid by donors. Zakat is an Islamic finance term referring to the obligation that Muslims, who are financially eligible, have to donate a certain proportion of wealth each year to charitable causes. Zakat is based on the income and assets of individuals. The concept of Islamic Zakat was distribution of wealth of the financially solvent to help the needy of the society. Utilized in a strategic way, Zakat can be a successful means of eradicating poverty from society.

Unfortunately in Bangladesh, the Zakat giving scenario is quite pitiful. Zakat payers in our country tend to purchase clothing and food for the poor. Even though the solution brings in temporary relief and happiness, it does not solve the issues of alleviating long-term poverty. According to a report by *the Financial Express*, it is estimated that approximately Tk 300 billion fund can be raised through Zakat in our country every year. But misuse and mismanagement of these funds fail to bring

actual positive change in the society.

SHOKKHOM started out initially to ensure successful utilization of Zakat fund to bring long-term positive change. A Zakat committee was formed with the sole responsibility of guiding the organization to utilize Zakat strategically and lawfully.

SUCCESS AND EXPANSION

Within months, SHOKKHOM projects brought huge profit to the beneficiaries and received applause from general people throughout our country. Many people showed interest in collaborating with us and provided their generous donations. SHOKKHOM donors and sponsors include people with diverse backgrounds, religion and ethnicity. This encouragement guided OBHIZATRIK Foundation to execute 1200 projects successfully and help approximately 4800 people to escape poverty.

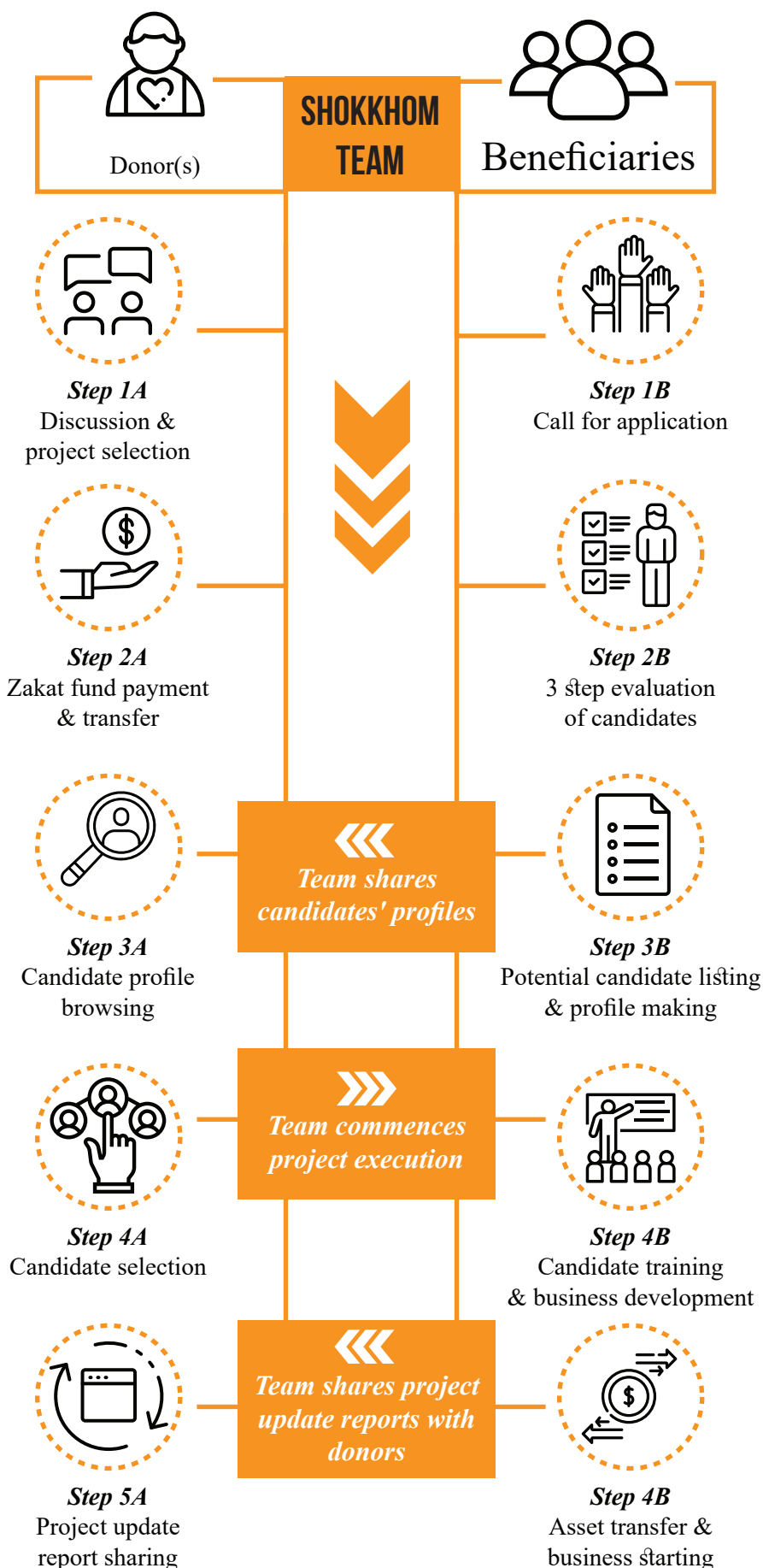
SHOKKHOM PROJECT'S MISSION

ERADICATE POVERTY AND BUILD FINANCIAL RESILIENCY

SHOKKHOM aims to alleviate poverty and eradicate it in the long-run. Training modules incorporated within the project helps build financial resiliency

HOW IT WORKS

Projects are executed after going through many stages of discussion, interviews, evaluation and monitoring. The entire process is strictly observed and approved by our established Zakat board consisting 5 reputed Islamic scholars who are experts in the knowledge of Zakat and its distribution. The working process of every project under SHOKKHOM are same and follows the stages as mentioned in the diagram. The stages are executed horizontally, where the SHOKKHOM team is simulatenously involved with the donors and candidates or potential beneficiaries. This process is supervised by the Zakat committee. Firstly, mutual discussions between the SHOKKHOM team and potential donors are held, where donors forward their inquiries. Our team guide the donors in choosing a project or multiple projects to contribute. Simultaneously, the candidate processing team carries out necessary actions to bring in applicants for SHOKKHOM. After initial discussion and selection as per the preference of the donors, our team accepts the Zakat funds given by the donors. By this time the candidate processing team are done with the primary candidate selection and conducts a three step evaluation of each potential candidates. These steps are primary interview, home visit and final interview. As soon as the Zakat fund is handed over and candidates are duly evaluated, the processing team makes detailed profiles containing necessary information about the potential beneficiaries. Our SHOKKHOM team shares these profiles with the Zakat donors for credibility and clarification.

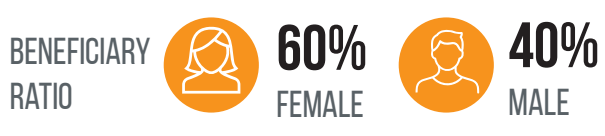
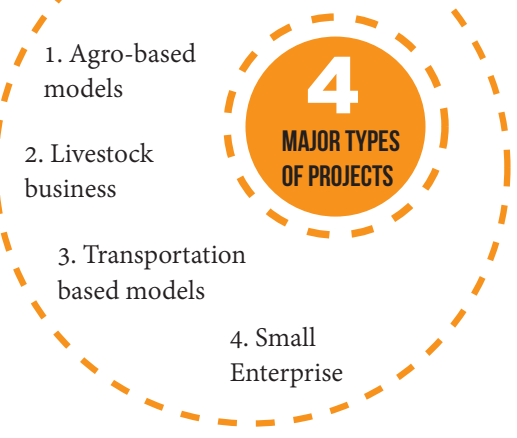

Until now 1200 families have successfully received projects under SHOKKHOM across 8 districts in Bangladesh. A majority number of our beneficiaries are females who have now become successful entrepreneurs through various projects. Among all our beneficiaries, 59% are based in Dhaka, 10% are based in Mymensingh, 5% in Rangapur, 7% in Kushtia, 8% in Patuakhali, 3% in Gazipur, 1% in Khagrachari and 7% in Barisal.

Under the Agro-based business models, project include:

1. Equipment and crop starter pack for land cultivation
2. Land with equipment and crop cultivation setup
3. Power tiller
4. Resource support for farmers

Livestock business modules include:

1. Cow farming
2. Goat farming
3. Poultry

I am Nilufa. I survived the Rana Plaza accident in 2013.

Despite being lucky enough to be spared by life, the accident left me permanently unnerved. Ever since that day I remain haunted, by the stench of the dead around me, haunted by the uncertainty that laid ahead of me. I was a respectable worker in the garments factory. But the accident left me mentally traumatized and too shaken to even think about entering the job again. For all these years I remained unemployed as I tried to cope with the accident.

As my husband lost his job during the COVID-19 pandemic, I was forced to rethink and look for a source of income. That's when I heard of this organization which offered income earning models for free. As I had experience with garments making, I applied for a sewing machine. I hope to earn income again with the help of this machine and eventually escape the nightmares of the accident haunting me.

SHOKKHOM MODEL VILLAGE IN TRISHAL, MYMENSINGH

EMPOWERING RURAL UNDERPRIVILEGED COMMUNITIES



The idea of a financially self-sufficient community evolved from the success of SHOKKHOM projects. Through SHOKKHOM, business model set-ups were provided to individual or a small group of people so that they can earn for themselves. After 6 years of execution, the success rate of our SHOKKHOM beneficiaries have peaked to the highest. This motivated us to implement SHOKKHOM on a larger scale. By following the business model design of SHOKKHOM projects funded by Zakat, business models were now provided to communities or targeted rural villages. SHOKKHOM implemented in a community scale will result in total development of that particular village along with mutual understanding, communal strength and empowerment among the villagers. Started from August 2021, the SHOKKHOM Model Village is a large scale community empowerment project that was conceptualized by OBHIZATRIK Foundation. SHOKKHOM Model Village is a vision of OBHIZATRIK Foundation to create a self-contained and self-sufficient community. The purpose of the initiative is to eradicate poverty from unfledged villages by creating sustainable livelihood models for every able-bodied habitant lying under the poverty line.

This type of ideal village ensures that the inhabitants of the village will be self-sufficed. Every member of the village will be a part of the scheme where they ensure all of the basic facilities to lead a healthy and blissful life with socio-economic and financial sustainability. It ensures the sustainable future of the resources. The forethought of affluent village will not be far away with this initiative.

It was initially implemented in multiple rural villages of Trishal Mymensingh under the joint collaboration with Akij Welfare Trust Ltd. In its pilot phase, more than 300 families of the villages of Bamnakhali, Raimoni, Fakirpara and Mukkhopur villages of Mothbari Union in Trishal were provided diverse business models. The projects provided varied according to beneficiaries' needs and popular businesses for that particular community. This will result in diversity of employment source. In the future, SHOKKHOM Model Village project will include various community development projects such as, school building, healthcare establishments, training centre building, religious institutions. Diversity always promotes sustainability and by implementing different kinds of livelihood as well as development projects within a particular village, the overall growth of that village from all aspects of life can be ensured.

In the beginning, we explored villages in Mymensingh that were immensely deprived. Villages within Trishal Upazila were shortlisted for the initial field survey. The first location selected was Bamnakhali village. Our team surveyed the project location and pointed out the low-income families of the villages. During the survey, our team shortlisted one capable person from each family who can run a small business as per their efficiency. Those persons applied with their required documents such as national identity card, reference person's identity card, and photos of their own. During the interview and asset analysis phase, we confirmed their entrepreneurship skills. After the screening process in the first phase, the project provided 70 beneficiaries with various small enterprises. These included auto-rickshaw, auto-van, grocery store, tea stall, tailor shop, cow farming, goat farming, and pisciculture. Moreover, we built houses in the village for those who did not have permanent shelter. Genial toilets were built for the practice of proper hygiene and sanitation. During the second phase, we chose Raymoni and Fakirpara where the condition is worse than Bamnakhali. The villagers of Fakirpara used to earn their living by begging. We supported 25 families from those villages with small business models. Additionally, we supported 55 families from Raymoni in the second phase. More projects are ongoing within these areas. We built around 24 houses with washroom facilities in our second phase. Our target location for the third phase of this project is Mukkhopur. Business models and development projects are currently ongoing in this area as well as the villages mentioned before. More villagers are applying for business models as former beneficiaries have started to acquire profit from their projects.

FREE HEALTHCARE FACILITIES FOR THE LESS PRIVILEGED

Underprivileged people in Bangladesh lack access to quality healthcare facilities. OBHIZATRIK Sustainable Health care program aims to ensure that everyone, especially women, children, and vulnerable populations, receives adequate, quality, and affordable health care facilities. We secure these facilities in close cooperation with local healthcare providers, national authorities, and international stakeholders.

The objective of the Health care program is to establish and strengthen a proper healthcare service for the destitute groups of people to improve their well being. The program has provided thousands of disadvantaged Bangladeshi men, women and children with access to essential, life saving medical care and resources.

Every month, we organize health camps in our Dhanmondi and Mirpur offices. These health camps, coordinated by local and national medical experts, aim to provide free-of-cost diagnosis and medicine to the disadvantaged group.

In the past, OBHIZATRIK Healthcare has provided free-of-cost services to approximately 5500 people across Bangladesh. We have distributed free medicines to people who were unable to purchase medicine. We have also collaborated with other NGOs to carry out vaccination programs in the slums of Dhaka.

OBHIZATRIK Foundation strongly supports the independence of self to make own choices related to their Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights. SRHR is not limited to a specific gender or age group and apply to all.

OBHIZATRIK Healthcare does not only provide free diagnoses and medicines. We also provide gender and sexuality education to young adolescent children. Beneficiaries are taught how to identify and avoid “fake information”, taboos and harmful practices. Additionally, youth-friendly SRHR workshops and classes organized occasionally create an enabling environment to reduce barriers to fulfill SRHR and to Reduce Sexual and Gender-based Violence.

We provide mental and psychological support to the children of OBHIZATRIK Schools. Trained and certified speakers use the power of personal stories and mental health education to inspire, engage, educate and equip young people to look out for themselves and their peers.

MEASURES AGAINST COVID-19

OBHIZATRIK Foundation was one of the very first responders to the COVID-19 virus outbreak in Bangladesh. Since the beginning of March 2020, volunteers of OBHIZATRIK Foundation carried out myriad of awareness and public disinfection campaigns throughout Dhaka city and other districts. During the initial stage of the outbreak, we installed awareness posters and banners in urban public locations. We made sure that important public locations across Dhaka city were regularly disinfected by germicides. Multiple hand-washing basins were set up across different points in Dhaka city to promote the habit of handwashing among the people. During the later stages, when the case of infected began to rise, we provided free COVID safety gears to the public to make them more conscious about the severity of the virus outbreak. These safety kits included hand sanitizers and medical-grade face masks. Storefronts, shops, bus stands and other public places were marked with equally distanced circles so that people practiced social distancing. When a severe shortage of PPE kits was noticed, OBHIZATRIK Foundation donated over 2500 PPE kits to doctors fighting COVID-19 from the frontlines.

The organization is also running an "Emergency Oxygen" campaign since the beginning of the pandemic. Through this campaign, we provide medical grade oxygen cylinders to serious patients who are unable to find immediate assistance from health facilities and are bound to stay home. The organization delivers these oxygen cylinders and other equipment to the patients' homes.

The organization's boat ambulance, MB Payra, aided the people of the remote Char areas during the pandemic. It transported patients from their homes to hospitals and isolation zones and also transported emergency oxygen cylinders. A special volunteer team was formed that conducted the proper burial procedure of deceased COVID victims.

BOAT AMBULANCE IN THE SOUTHERN CHAR AREAS



ABOUT OBHIZATRIK HEALTHCARE

The Boat ambulance named “MB Payra” is used for emergency medical care in southern char areas of Rangabali and Golachipa Upazila of Patuakhali district in Bangladesh. The idea of boat ambulance came to the members of OBHIZATRIK Foundation while we were working on a project with IDLC to build a school for underprivileged children in Charlata area of Patuakhali.

While establishing the school, our team had noticed the challenging lifestyle of the coastal people. The transit infrastructure of those remote char areas is brittle. There are around 2 lakh people in Rangabali who were being deprived of their fundamental health rights due to poor communication and transportation system. The residents of 5 unions- Rangabali, Chalitabunia, Char Mantaj, Choto Baishdia, Boro Baishdia under Rangabali upazila are locked by river on rivers on three sides and the sea on the other. Every time someone from the area gets sick or an emergency situation arises, they had to cross the river Agunmukha by trawler to reach the nearest hospital in Galachipa which robs them of some vital hours. Patients had to wait all night for a boat or trawler to go to the nearest hospital. Even in case of critical conditions, there is a huge record of patients' death. We felt an urge to resolve the issue but due to lack of funding our hands were tied. That is when IDLC, one of the largest non-banking financial institutions in Bangladesh stepped in to support us.

IDLC works with the slogan “Financing Happiness”. As they believe in contributing to the grassroots for a greater change in the society, granting loans to non-profit organizations is one of their most popular schemes. So, after receiving the proposal for boat ambulance from OBHIZATRIK Foundation, they selected the idea and decided to be the benefactor of the program.

Moved by the plights of these people, IDLC started working on the boat ambulance project in the middle of 2019. The boat ambulance was designed by the OBHIZATRIK Foundation team. In a 26-foot long and 8-foot-wide boat ambulance, managed to keep a space for emergency delivery. The engine power of the boat is 110 HP along with top speed of 45 knot. It can accommodate 10 people along with two patient beds. It also includes medical facilities like emergency oxygen supply, medicine and first aid. The idea is to keep a medical assistant along with a driver and a manager.

When the ambulance was ready, we started campaigning in markets and public places. In 2019, we launched the boat ambulance for the people. The boat ambulance can reach patients from any of the five unions of the upazila within 24 hours and take them to the nearest headquarters hospital within 20–30 minutes. So far, we have served 550+ patients with the ambulance.

Furthermore, the ambulance was used to distribute relief materials to the flood affected people since its inauguration. It had also played a crucial role in providing medical facilities to the COVID-19 infected patients of the Southern Char region. Around 200 COVID-19 patients were facilitated with emergency transportation to the nearest hospitals of Patuakhali. Moreover, our special volunteer team was engaged to transport the COVID-19 infected dead bodies for the burial ritual. More than 100 COVID-19 infected bodies were buried by our special team.

We intend to increase the boat ambulance facility if the situation demands. The objective of this project is to provide access to healthcare services for Char area inhabitants.



FOOD AND NUTRITION PROGRAM

ESTABLISHING FOOD SECURITY

Proper nutrition is the substratum of human development. By our nutrition program not only the children but also the adult and aged group of underprivileged community are being benefitted.

Well-nourished children are better able to grow, learn, play and participate in their community development. They are also more alert in crisis situation.

The poorest and most vulnerable disadvantaged group of children are not getting the nutrition they need to survive and thrive because of their inaccessibility to proper health and nutrition facilities. At least one in three children under 5 is affected by malnutrition. To combat hunger and poverty-related starvation, our Food and Nutrition program oversees free food campaigns.

For the children of our three school branches, we arrange monthly grocery event where the families of the children are given a grocery bag consisting of daily food commodities stock for a month. Additionally, we also provide the bag to the beneficiaries of our livelihood programs. Besides our beneficiaries we also provided grocery bags to the other needy dwellers of the suburbs and slum areas surrounding our benefitted areas. Under this nutrition program of OBHIZATRIK Foundation more than 10 lakhs people have been benefitted.

We have implemented our nutrition program with different events including Joy of Giving, Bina Poyshar Bazar & Amar Dawat.

FOOD AND NUTRITION PROGRAM
ESTABLISHING FOOD SECURITY

JOY OF GIVING

Joy of Giving program launched in 2014 by OBHIZATRIK foundation to provide varieties of aids and supports of food and nutrition facilities for the underprivileged community. The program includes Ramadan Sehri, Iftar, Grocery package which has rice, pulses, chick-peas, oil, sugar, salt and packets of vermicelli.

We have organized several events under this program which includes “Sobar Jonno Iftar” & “Seheri Deen”. In ‘Sobar Jonno Iftar’, we provide the after meal of breaking fast in Ramadan.

In “Sehri Deen”, we provide the pre-meal of fasting during the Ramadan. We have provided yearly sehri and iftar to more than 15 lakhs till now.

The joy of giving makes a person expand his or her life to a great extent. The best part is it gives a sense of satisfaction after doing a bit for the people around us who are in need of that. The mere act of giving fills a person’s life with joy and one’s own happiness multiples. “We make a living by what we get, we make a life by what we give” - a quotation by Winston S. Churchill, that energizes us to be a part of this noble initiative.

Besides these events, each year we also provide Qurbani meat to around 50000 underprivileged who in general do not have the capability to take part in the sacrifice of Qurbani Eid festival.

A FREE VEGETABLE MARKET DURING THE PANDEMIC

BINA POYSAY BAZAR

The Covid 19 pandemic has worsened the pre-existing crisis of child malnutrition, threatening families' livelihoods, disrupting the availability and affordability of nutritious and safe diets, and straining the delivery of essential nutrition services with dire consequences for the most vulnerable children.

We started this initiative to support those low-income people who could not maintain their family expenses due to loss of jobs during COVID-19 pandemic. Standard Chartered Bank, a renowned financial institution partnered with us in this humane deed.

We provided various vegetables with free of cost at different locations of Dhaka. Our volunteer team sat with several stalls as isles full of vegetables. We covered Bihari camp, Mirpur 1, Shatarkul, Khilgaon. Sobujbagh, Jafrabad, Tongi in Dhaka, Chittagong town and Khagrachori. In this project, the number of beneficiaries is more than 2 lakhs.

AMAR DAWAT FOOD HANGER



This is a social inclusive project, funded by Daraz. It was mainly planned to make an effective contribution in alleviating hunger and misery of the underprivileged people of Bangladesh. Amar Dawat has been designed for anyone and everyone who calls for a snack at any given moment. The stores under the Amar Dawat project acts as platforms to bring together people of different economic background. Some are benefitted by accepting the snacks and some take part by donating for the smooth operation of this humane initiation. The project has been successfully implemented for a year now. The project is active in 30 shops of Dhaka city. Each beneficiary is given a packet of bun, a banana and a cup of tea with free of cost. This is in turn helping out minimum 16000 people monthly.

Due to the Covid 19 pandemic and consecutive lockdowns, underprivileged children in Bangladesh were unable to access much-needed nutrition and health services. This includes routine immunization, treatment for illnesses including mid-day meals and so on.

There is a severe disruption in the delivery of public health and nutrition services, which are the main channels for these children. In addition, the prolonged closure of schools has brought the education of millions of children to a halt. Schools are not just for learning, but also places where children socialize, develop emotionally and some find a refuge from troubled family life. Globally, one in seven children's mental health and well-being is at risk due to pandemic-induced lockdowns.

OBHIZATRIK Foundation always felt an urge to support and stand beside these underprivileged people in times of their need. We believe one of the most important things for our own happiness is the act of giving joy, happiness, courage, compassion to others.

YOUTH VOLUNTEERING

ACTIVE IN PROVIDING EMERGENCY RELIEF

The power of OBHIZATRIK Foundation lies with the thousands of youth volunteers actively participating in our events and projects. Our orange team of volunteers are dedicated in their efforts to bring positive change in the country. Aside the long-term sustainable projects, OBHIZATRIK Foundation regularly organizes short-term campaigns which involves providing emergency aid, food relief and building awareness. All of our short-term campaigns are implemented by the volunteers of OBHIZATRIK Foundation.

There are approximately 3500 registered volunteers under OBHIZATRIK Foundation. These young change-makers are spread across the country and are the first responders to any emergency situation arising anytime. Our volunteers have contributed with their valuable assistance during COVID awareness campaigns, emergency oxygen delivering during the pandemic, food support programs, distributing emergency aid and medicines during natural disasters such as Amphan storm and monsoon flood, grocery distribution, winter blanket distribution and any other crisis situations which arise.

Vulnerable fraction, such as elderly or children suffer the most during the cold waves. Approximately 20.5% population of Bangladesh lives below the poverty line. To help these people during the harsh winter times, OBHIZATRIK Foundation regularly organizes the "Winter Gift campaign". As part of the campaign, we provide free blankets, winter garments and accessories to underprivileged people across the country. The campaign takes place in different districts across Bangladesh. Volunteers of OBHIZATRIK Foundation oversees smooth operation of the winter campaigns.

The objective of the recurring campaign is to provide warmth and comfort to the less privileged from the winter. The campaign aims to spread the message of sympathy and love for the underprivileged of our society.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

During COVID-19 crisis in 2020, the Standard Chartered Bank Limited funded the “Bina Poysay Bazar” food support campaign by helping more than 2 lacs families with fresh vegetables and fruits.

DARAZ BANGLADESH LIMITED

The “Amar Dawat” project is a sustainable project jointly operated by ‘Amar Daraz’ and OBHIZATRIK Foundation. This project address the SDG 2: Zero Hunger and provides approximately 16,000 people with free food every month.

OBHIZATRIK School’s Char Lata branch provides full-free quality education to approximately 200 students in the remote village of Patuakhali district. This school was funded by IDLC Finance Limited. OBHIZATRIK Foundation’s boat ambulance, MB Payra is also a collaborative project with IDLC Finance Limited. The boat ambulance serves the remote Char areas of the south. It is active in 3 sub-districts in the southern region of Bangladesh.

AKIJ WELFARE TRUST

The SHOKKHOM Model Village is a joint endeavour with Akij Welfare Trust has empowered 300 families in Trishal upazila of Mymensingh. This project will provide livelihood business models to underprivileged village people in remote villages of Bangladesh to establish development in community scale.

HUAWEI BANGLADESH

When schools were sanctioned for temporary closure during the COVID-19 pandemic, Huawei Bangladesh supported the continuation of education in OBHIZATRIK School by providing us digital equipment for taking online classes. OBHIZATRIK School received laptops and tablets from Huawei Bangladesh to promote e-learning among the less privileged.

MERIDIAN FINANCE LIMITED

Meridian Finance Ltd. provided full setup for digitizing classrooms in OBHIZATRIK School’s Mirpur branch. Digital classroom equipment included projected, a smart television and internet connection setup.

RENATA LIMITED

During the beginning of the pandemic, OBHIZATRIK Foundation collaborated with Renata Limited and installed public handwash basins across Dhaka, provided face-masks, sanitizers, and grocery bags across Bangladesh. During the 2020 diarrhoea breakout in Patuakhali, Renata provided saline packets and medicines among the rural villages to fight the disease.

FORTITUDE GLOBAL FOUNDATION

In 2021, Fortitude Global Foundation collaborated with OBHIZATRIK School to oversee the continuation of education of unsponsored children. Additionally they provided winter garments for students of OBHIZATRIK School.

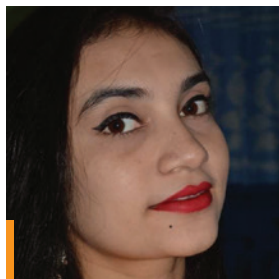

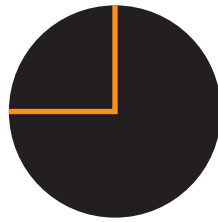


EXTERNAL AUDITORS

We describe these matters in our auditor's report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

Report on other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

In accordance with the Companies Act 1994, we also report that:
