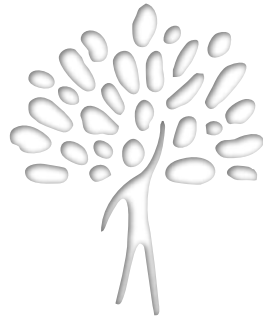

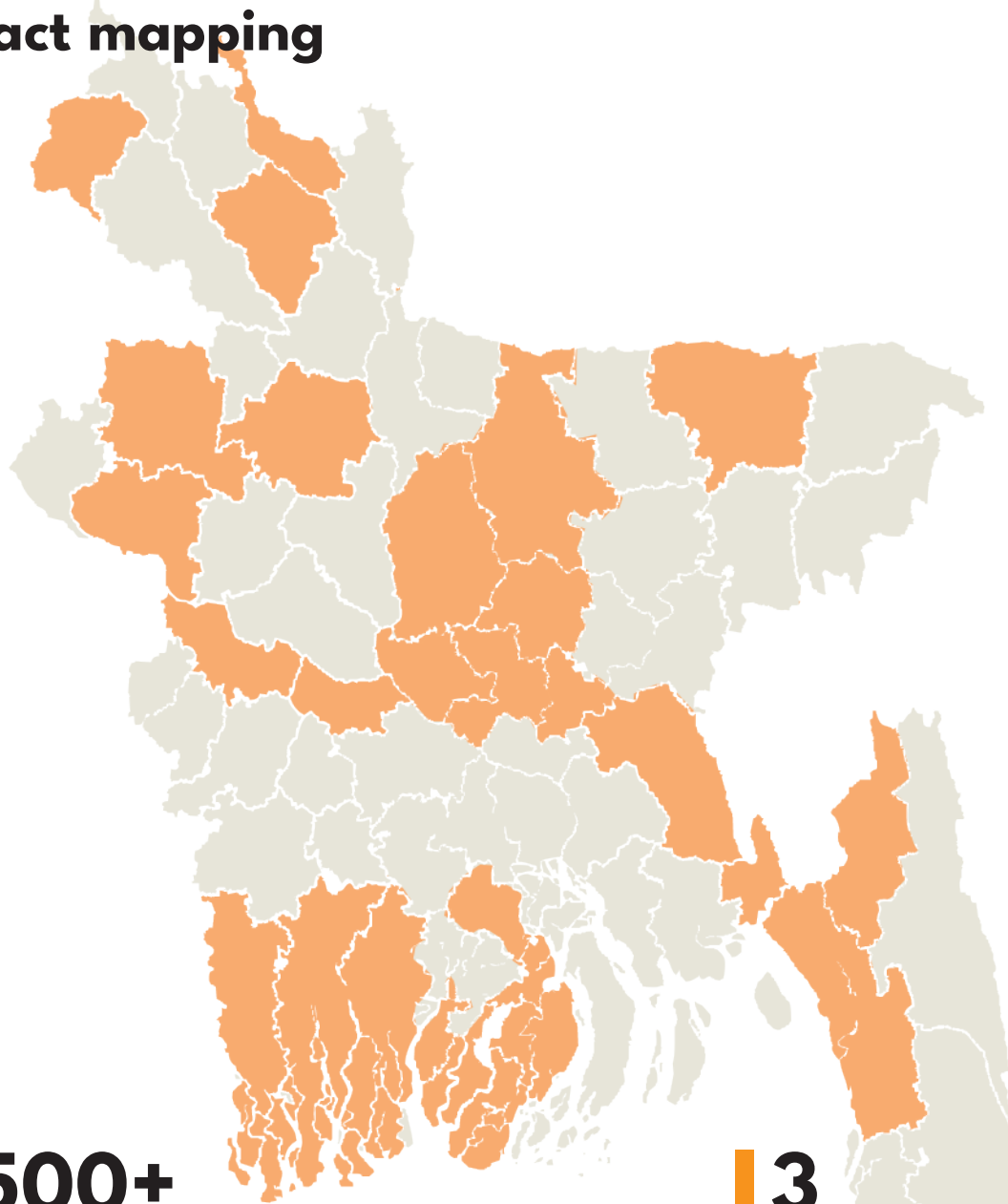

**O**BHIZATRIK Foundation is a non-profit organization (NGOAB Reg no. 3301, Society Reg no. S-12013) focused on improving the various socio-economic issues haunting Bangladesh. The organization's prime target group for project conceptualization and implementation are the underprivileged population of our country.

Established in 2010 and registered under Government of Bangladesh (S-12013), OBHIZATRIK Foundation has since been engaged in various short-term and long term projects and campaigns to bring about positive impact in the lives and livelihood of many Bangladeshis living below the poverty line.

In 2022, OBHIZATRIK Foundation completed 12 years of activity. The organization has benefitted more than 2500 beneficiaries through long-term projects and approximately 5.5 lac people through short-term campaigns and emergency aid.



### Mission

*To help the underprivileged overcome their limitations caused by economic insufficiency by providing them quality education, free health care facilities, and small sustainable enterprises to ensure a prosperous life for them.*



### Vision

*Our vision is to eradicate mass poverty in Bangladesh and equip citizens with practical skills and education so that they can be self-reliant and truly independent. In addition, working to empower the youth of Bangladesh with a view to developing the nation by reallocating skills and resources to foster self-reliance and growth in every citizen by facilitating volunteerism in Bangladesh*

## Born to change Bangladesh

We are consistently supported by our strong body of more than 3500 volunteers across the country, over 800 donors, more than 50 corporate sponsors and multiple INGOs located in Bangladesh and around the world.

The head office of OBHIZATRIK Foundation is located in Mirpur, Dhaka. Besides this, there are two more branch offices located on Char Lata in Patuakhali district and Rayerbazar in Dhaka. OBHIZATRIK School has three campuses in Mirpur and Rayerbazar in Dhaka and in Char Lata village in Patuakhali. The organization regularly carries out food support campaigns, health camps and other volunteering events across 32 districts in Bangladesh through the active volunteer network. SHOKKHOM livelihood projects have been implemented in Dhaka, Mymensingh, Gazipur, Rangpur, Kushtia, and Patuakhali. Boat ambulance is active in approximately 6 sub-districts in Patuakhali's coastal areas.

Currently, OBHIZATRIK Foundation has approximately 50 full-time hard-working employees and more than 3500 volunteers who help execute all the projects and campaigns.

We, at OBHIZATRIK Foundation promote equality in work environments and are proud of the 60% female changemakers who work diligently to reduce the socio-economic disparities of our country.

## Active programs and projects



OBHIZATRIK Foundation currently strives to fulfill the Sustainable Development Goals 1-No poverty, 2-Zero Hunger, 3-Good Health and well-being and 4-Quality Education.

The organization has an extensive track record of conducting a diverse range of projects, both short-term and long-term as well as campaigns under 6 different kinds of programs that include:

The projects under the above programs ensure providing full-free quality education, livelihood earning opportunities, ensuring food and nutrition security and free healthcare facilities for the less-privileged. Additionally, our voluntary activities include organizing and executing food campaigns for the destitute, providing relief medicine and resource support during times of crisis and natural disasters, distributing free healthcare equipment to rural health workers, providing winter gifts to the underprivileged and carrying free educational program related to maternal health and child health and sanitation behavior.

## **OBHIZATRIK School**

Inaugurated in 2013, OBHIZATRIK School aimed to make quality education accessible to the underprivileged children of our country. Many children in Bangladesh are deprived of the fundamental right to education due to poverty and financial insolvency. Children who are unable to acquire basic education face many challenges in their adult lives. Inadequacies in basic education prevents people to flourish to their fullest. Poverty and financial problems among the underprivileged society force many children with bright potential to drop out of schools. These children are later exposed to harsh child labour and child marriages.

OBHIZATRIK School aims to uproot this long-running problem prevalent in our country. Our school focuses on providing basic formal education to underprivileged children. On top of being fully free, OBHIZATRIK School also provides all sorts of learning accessories, food and healthcare support to encourage underprivileged children to attend school regularly.

Every month our students receive health check-up facilities and free medicines from the school. During any religious and national festivities students are provided special meals and gifts to commemorate the day. We also organize annual festivals to encourage students to take active part in competitive activities. Students are taken to study tours, annual picnics and workshops that promote their overall development.

## Health and Nutrition program

To combat hunger and poverty-related starvation, our Health and Nutrition program oversees free food-giving projects and campaigns. We have implemented our nutrition program with different events including Joy of Giving, Bina Poyshar Bazar & Amar Dawat.

### Joy of Giving

The aim of this campaign is to include the underprivileged members of our society during the celebration of Ramadan, Eid and other festivities. We share the joy of these events with the people by providing them cooked meals, grocery packs and special meals.

### Bina Poyshar Bazar

This campaign was inaugurated during the COVID-19 pandemic when the prices of food and vegetables were a soaring high and people couldn't work to earn money. Designed to imitate a grocery store, the campaign provided the destitute of our society to pick whatever vegetable they wanted.

### Amar Dawat

Initiated two years ago, Amar Dawat is a long-running project funded by Daraz Bangladesh. This project provides free meal of bread, banana and tea to anyone who asks for it. Approximately 9000 people receive food aid monthly and more than 200,000 people across the capital have benefitted from the Amar Dawat project.

## Livelihood program

With a view to empowering the extremely poor population of our society, OBHIZATRIK Foundation first conceptualized the project SHOKKHOM. In 2016, SHOKKHOM was implemented at a very small scale involving only two families. Within months, the beneficiaries reaped the positive outcomes of the project by gaining financial solvency. Today, after almost 6 years of activity, SHOKKHOM has empowered more than 4800 people across 8 districts in Bangladesh.

SHOKKHOM provides fully-developed, free-of-cost business model setups to eradicate poverty. The projects are funded by Zakat given by the donors. This program is centered on improving the lives and livelihood of the underprivileged.

### Process

SHOKKHOM projects are handed over to potential beneficiaries following an extensive 4-step process. Starting from accepting applications from enthusiastic candidates, to evaluating their credentials, interviewing them, selecting the final candidates, training them and finally transferring project assets to them.

### Business model types

Currently there are 4 main categories under which several business models are provided based on the skill sets and prior experience of the candidates.

## Community development program

Following the success of SHOKKHOM, it became necessary to implement the similar idea of empowering underprivileged people on a mass scale. This could be done by targeting specific communities or villages that are extremely impoverished and conducting development projects such as building shelters for the homeless, equipping existing houses with electricity facilities, drinking water provisions, setting up hygienic toilets etc.

This program also ensures that the inhabitants of the villages or communities will be self-sufficient socially, economically and financially.

In the future, projects under this program will aim bigger by adopting initiatives to set up educational institutions, healthcare establishments, training centers etc. These kind of development projects will ensure the overall growth of the targeted village from all aspects.

## Emergency response and Climate action

During any sudden crises or on the wake of any natural disasters, OBHIZATRIK Foundation has always been the fastest responders. Our volunteers and dedicated teams engage in on-field expeditions to carry and distribute food aid, relief, clothing and medicines to the victims.

Quite recently we have provided support to the victims of Sitrang cyclone and the monsoon floods.

### Response to climate change

With the onset of global warming and drastic changes in our climate, we are carrying out small-scale tree plantation programs. Through this campaign we involved the students of OBHIZATRIK School to teach them about the adverse effects of climate change and the important role played by plants to maintain balance in the climate. In the end, they planted several fruits, vegetable and medicinal plants and thus took part in fighting climate degradation. In the future, we are hopeful to execute the project on a city scale.

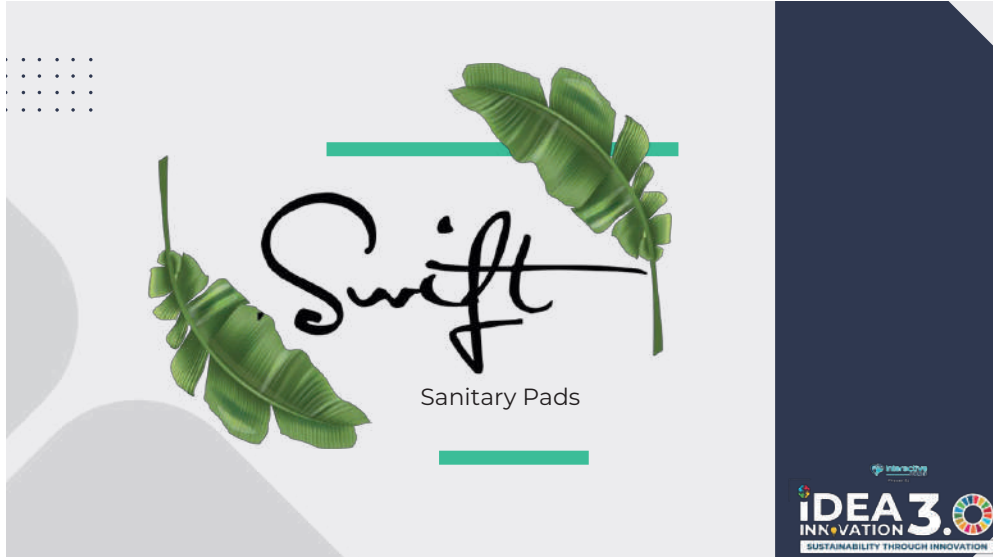

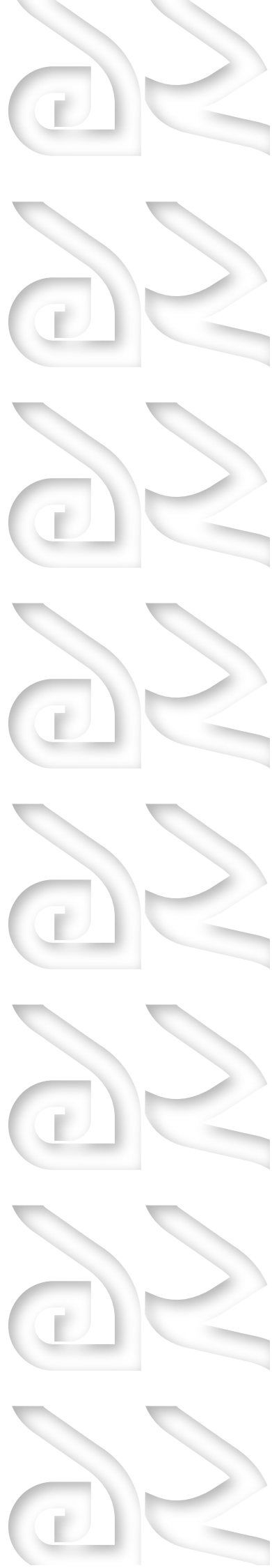

**Opinion**



**1.00 Reporting Entity**

**1.01 Formation and Legal Status**

Obhizatrik Foundation is a non-government, non-profitable, non-political, voluntary and charitable organization. It has been registered under the provisions of the Foreign Donations (Voluntary Activities) Regulation Act, 2016 on 4th July 2022. The Registration Number is - 3301. Obhizatrik Foundation has also been registered under the society Registration Act, XXI of 1860 on 27th November 2014. The registration number is S-12013. The Registered office of the foundation is situated at Road No- 2D, House No- 5, Pallabi, Mirpur, Dhaka-1216, Bangladesh.

**Operational Area:** The area of operation of the foundation is all over Bangladesh.

**1.02 Objectives of the Organization**

Obhizatrik Foundation is working to focus on empowering the underprivileged population all over the country. The aim of the Foundation is to interdependent our country through working on these sectors: Poverty, Education, Health and Nutrition, Human Rights, Environment, etc.

**1.03 Fund Mobilization and Utilization**

The Foundation Accepts donation, in cash or cheque, from its members or board of directors or from any other person, institution, foundation or company from home or abroad and the donation received will only be used towards the promotion and maintenance of the objectives of the foundation.

**1.04 Utilization of Other Income of the Foundation**

The other income will be added with Fund after proper taxation applicable by Finance Act.

**1.05 Board of Governors**

**2.04 Functional and presentational currency**

These financial statements are prepared in Bangladesh Taka (Taka/Tk/BDT), which is the Company's functional currency. All financial information presented in Taka has been rounded off to the nearest integer unless otherwise indicated.

**2.05 Use of estimates and judgments**

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

**Depreciation**

Items of property, plant and equipments are depreciated from the date they are available for use and ready for use.

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of items of property, plant and equipments less their estimated residual values using the straight-line basis over their estimated useful lives. Depreciation is generally recognized in profit or loss, unless the amount is included in the carrying amount of another asset. For addition to property, plant and equipments, depreciation is provided on a pro-rata basis on the property, plant and equipments acquired and disposed during the year. The rates at which property, plant and equipments are depreciated for current and comparative years are given below:

Depreciation methods, rates and residual values are reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted if appropriate.

Fixed Asset has not been included in financial statements previously. The Management of OBHIZATRIK Foundation has decided to include fixed assets in the financial statements for actual understanding and better presentation through retrospective approach and for that reason, fixed assets have been included in the financial statements both current and comparative year.

**3.02 Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand and cash at banks which are held by the entity without any restriction.

**3.03 Provisions**

A provision is recognized in the statement of financial position when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of past event. It is provable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provision is ordinarily measured at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the reporting date.

Income tax expense has been charged on other income and provisions are made accordingly.

**3.04 Office Rent**

If Office rent agreement period is more than one year, it is treated as per IFRS 16. As OBHIZATRIK Foundation's Office rent agreement is only for one year, it is not treated under IFRS 16.
